


The Chinatown-Lower East Side Literacy Zone,

The Chinatown-Lower East Side Literacy Zone supports immigrants and their families through English language classes and a full range of supportive services. Our English classes serve students at all levels, helping them to build a solid foundation in reading, writing and speaking skills while also providing a welcoming and practical introduction to American life and culture.

Our two on-site Literacy Zone counselors offer guidance and referrals in education, jobs and careers, housing, legal issues, immigration issues, childcare and other services for parents.

Eligibility and Enrollment for English classes in University Settlement's Adult Literacy Program

- All English classes are FREE and open to any adult, 16 years old or older.
- Classes run from September through June.
- Registration opens in May and closes when classes are full.
- Enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Classes are offered at different levels and taught in English only.
- Classes are offered weekday mornings and evenings as well as weekend mornings and afternoons.
- Good attendance is required.
